



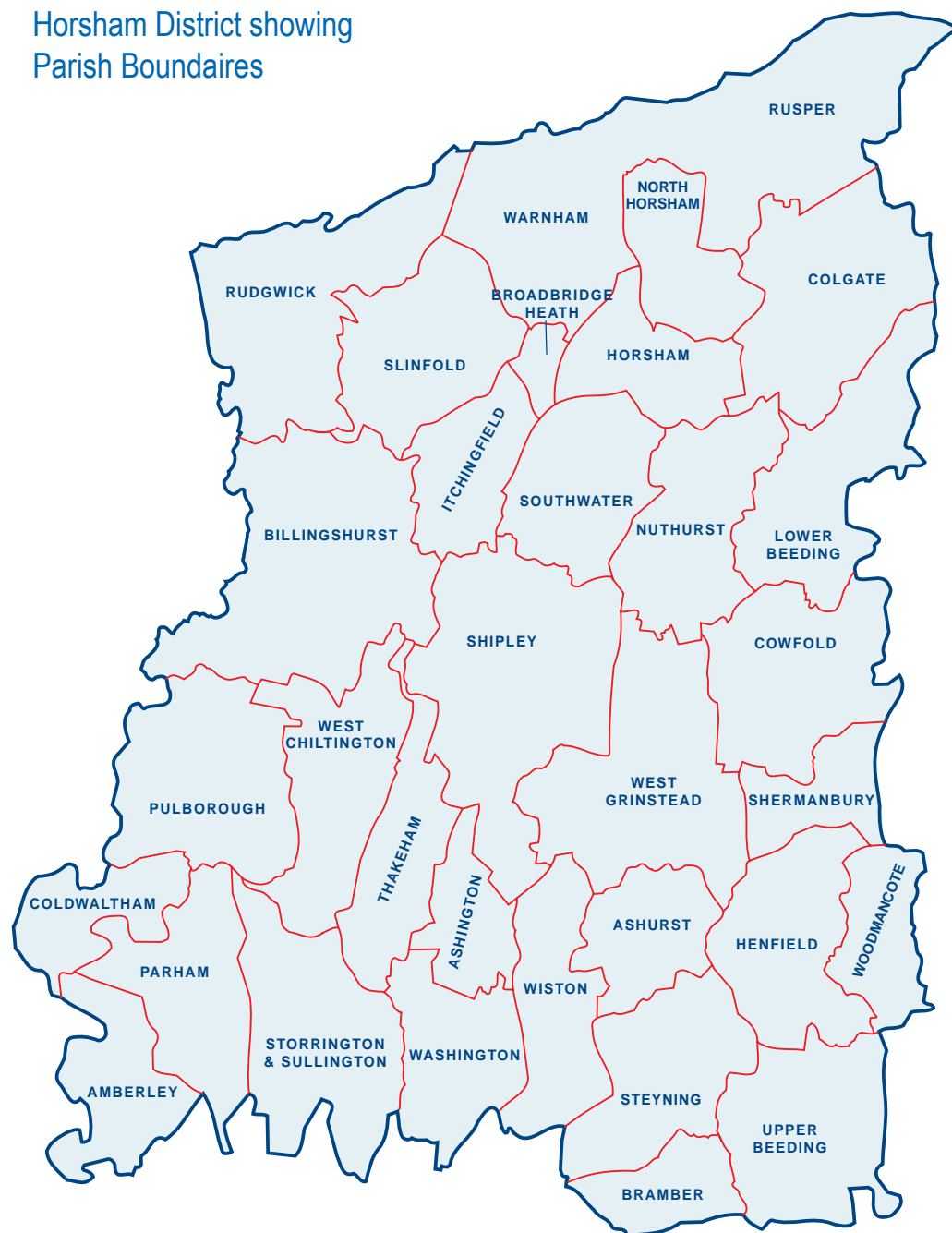

This document has been compiled to assist Councillors and officers within Horsham District Council (and other external partners) to make informed decisions based on an understanding of the demographic make up of the district.

Demographic Profile: how the District is made up

Population headlines

2001 to 2011 Comparison:

- 20% drop in 30-44's in the Horsham District since 2001
- 18% increase in 45-59's the Horsham District since 2001
- 40% increase in 60-65's in the Horsham District since 2001

2011 comparison with England Average:

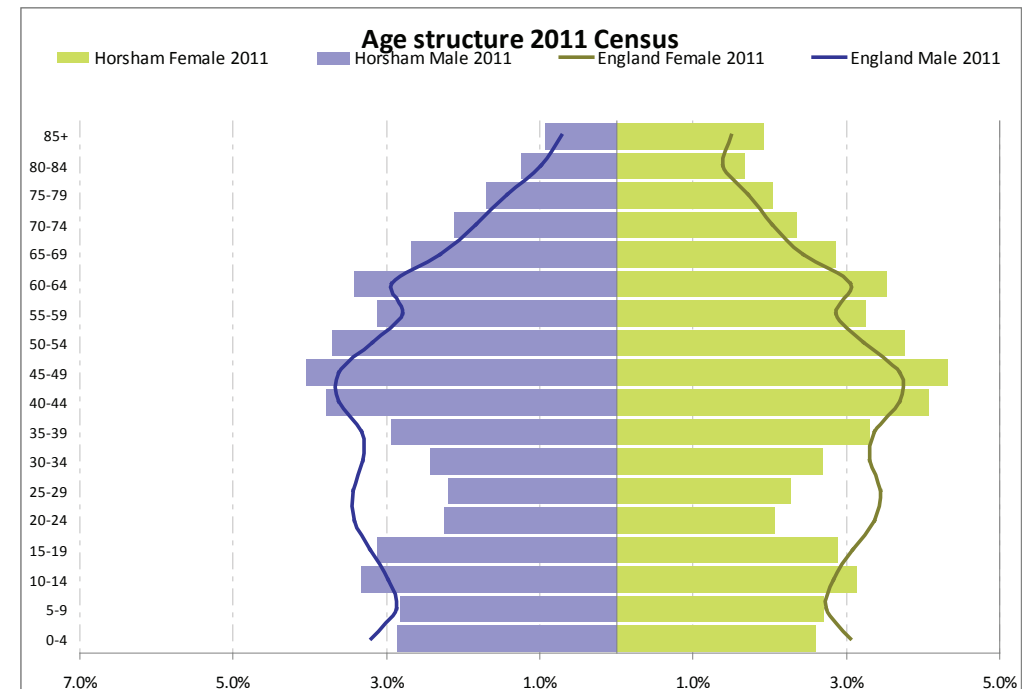
- Age 20-29 - the Horsham District is 56% less than England
- Age 45-59 - the Horsham District is 14% higher than England
- Age 85+ - the Horsham District is 23% higher than England



Understanding the impact of an ageing population

- Horsham District has an older population than both the national average and the South East average
- The number of people aged 60-65 and 45-49 is disproportionately higher

Household Composition

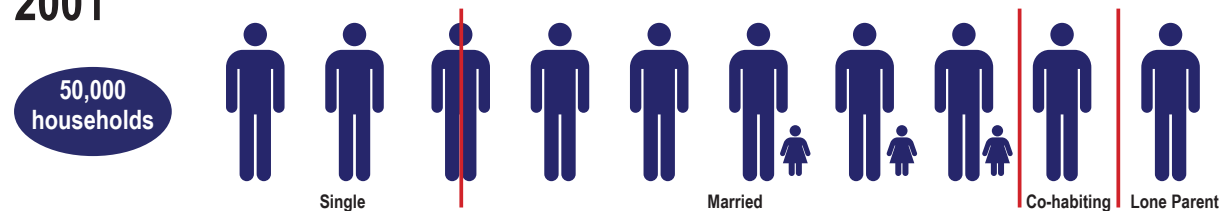
2001 to 2011 Comparison:

- Total number of households has increased by almost 10%
- In 2011 single person households made up 28% of households, an increase of 16% since 2001. This is less than the national figure of 30% in 2011.
- Married families with dependant children made up 19% of households in 2011. This has dropped by 10% since the 2001 Census.
- Lone parent households with dependant children made up 4.5% of households in 2011.
- In 2011 there were 257 male lone parents and 2,203 female. Of these, 83% of males and 71% of females were in either full or part time employment. Nationally 67% of male and 59% of female lone parents were in employment

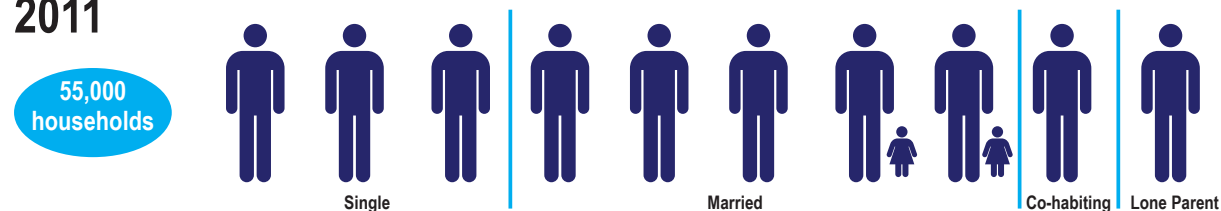

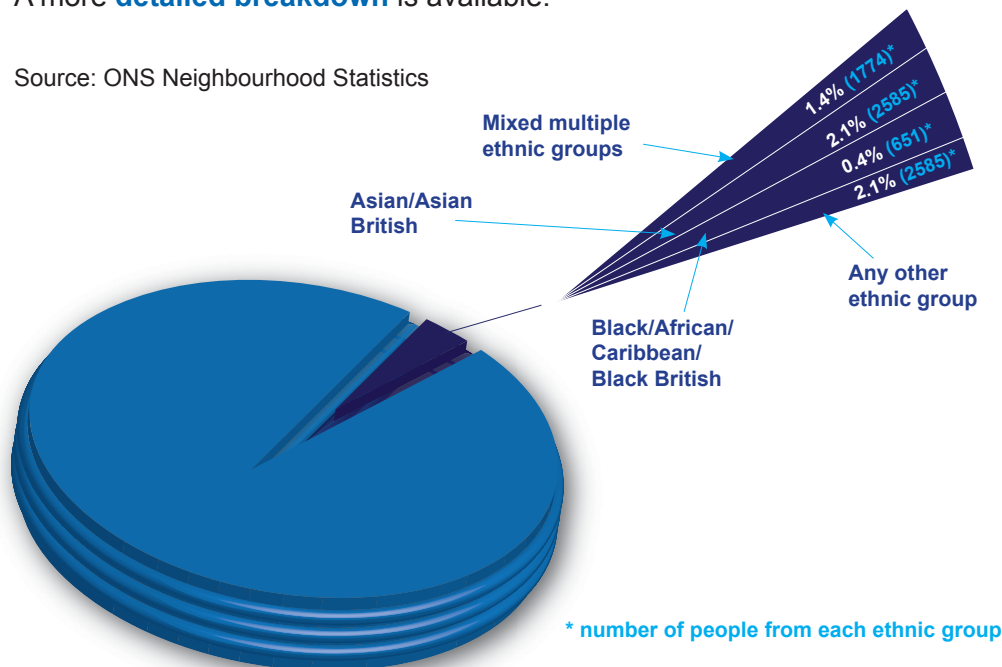
Ethnic Group

2001 to 2011 Comparison:

- The total population in Horsham has increased by 8% since 2001.
- The total white population has decreased a little since the 2001 Census from 98% to 96%. Nationally this figure is 86%.
- While the number of residents from ethnic groups are small generally, there has been a 3 fold increase from 674 in 2001 to 2585 in 2011 in Asian/Asian British ethnicity
- The African/Caribbean/Black British population has almost doubled from 337 to 651

Religion and Belief

2001 to 2011 Comparison:

- 64% of residents described themselves as Christian in 2011. This is a 12% decrease since the 2001 Census, and is in line with national trends
- 27% of residents described themselves as having no religion in 2011, an 87% increase since the 2001 Census. This is slightly higher than the national figure of 25%.
- In 2011 there was a 24% increase in residents who have not stated their religion compared with the 2001 Census

Health and Disability

Deafness:

Approximately one in 6 people nationally have some form of hearing loss (slight/moderate and profound). Most of these people will be older people who have age-related hearing loss.

There are an estimated 12,700 people in Horsham District who have a hearing loss that is moderate or more (9.7% of the local population)

Visual Impairment:

Approximately two-thirds of blind and partially sighted people are over the age of 75. There are an estimated 2550 people over the age of 65 in Horsham District who have a visual impairment (1.9% of the local population).

Mental Health:

One in 4 people are likely to have a mental health issue sometime during the course of a year (source: Mind - one of UK's leading mental health charities)
Depression is just one type of mental health issue.

Learning Disability:

Approximately 2% of the population have a learning disability. The figure is estimated to rise over the next few years.

Wheelchair Users:

The Horsham District Shopmobility service provides scooters, powerchairs and wheelchairs to aid shopping for people with mobility issues. However, not all users may live in the District and may come from other areas.

Unpaid Care

- In the Horsham District there has been a 17% increase in caring responsibilities since 2001
- In 2011, 3,509 residents provided 20 or more hours of care, an increase of 44% since 2001
- In 2011, 10,133 residents provided less than 20 hours a week of care

Sexual Orientation

Around 1.5% of the population in the South East self identify as lesbian, gay or bisexual (LGB). An estimated 2000 lesbian, gay and bisexual people live in the Horsham District.

Economic Development

Economic Activity

69,240 residents in the Horsham district are economically active
Unemployment has increased from 1.57% in 2001 to 2.7% in 2011, but it is still well below the national figure of 4.4%

The number of people economically active but are looking after home or family has dropped by 60% which is very similar to the national figure
The number of people who are economically inactive long term sick or disabled is unchanged from 2001, but at 2.2% is well below the national figure of 4.4%

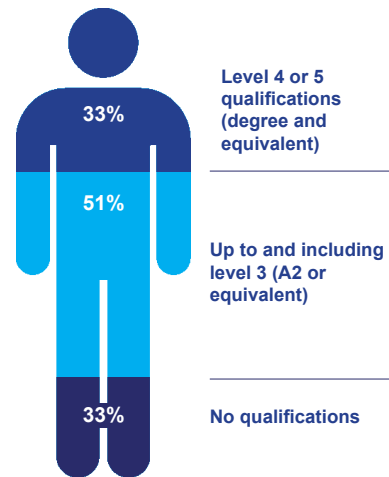

Residents' Qualification Levels

- The number of people with no qualifications in 2011 is 30% less than the national average
- The number of people with level 3 qualifications in 2011 is 38% more than the 2001 percentage
- The number of people with level 4 or 5 qualifications in 2011 is 42% more than 2001 percentage

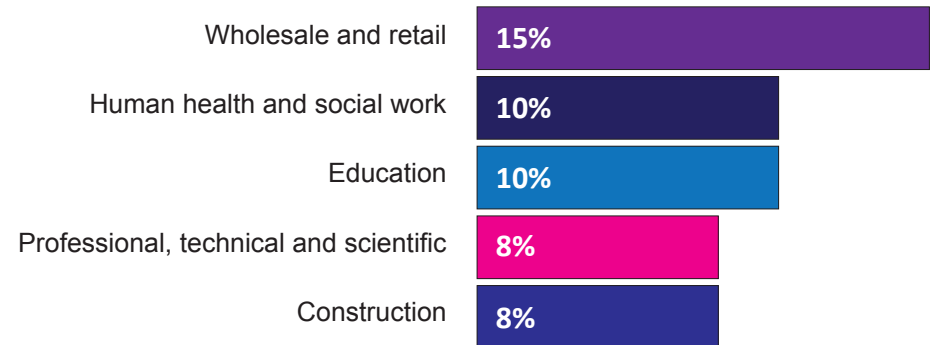

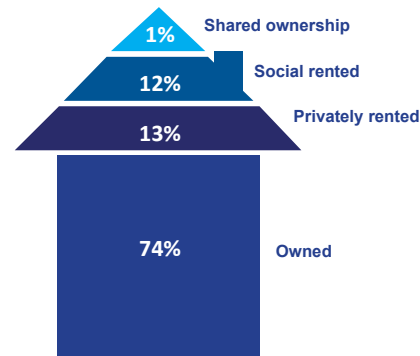

House Ownership/Tenure

- Household ownership has increased by 20% since 2001
- Private landlord rental has increased by 43%, however this is still much lower than the England percentage

Accommodation Type

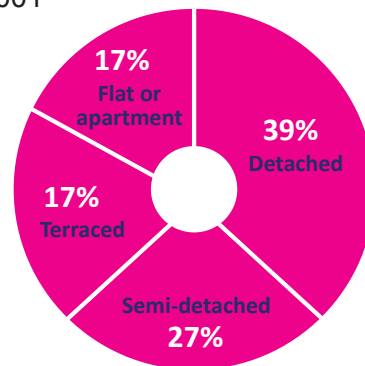
- There has been no significant change since 2001

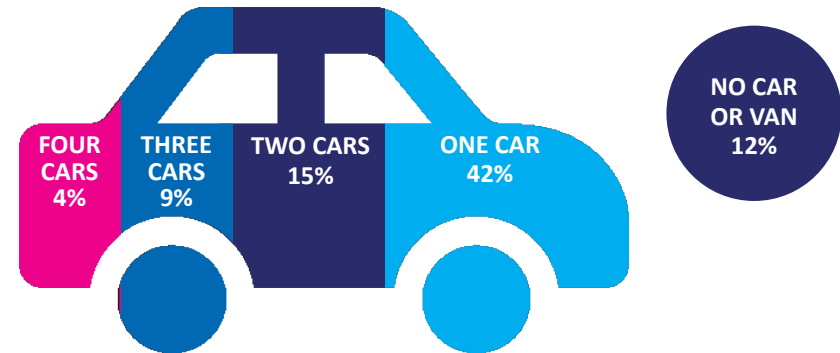




Transport

Car or Van availability

Information about the number of cars or vans available to members of households.



- There are over 85,000 cars and vans in households in the Horsham district
- 12% of households in Horsham have no access to a car or van but England has more than twice as many households with no car or van, but (6,497 households)
- There are 30% more households with 2 cars or vans in Horsham than the national figure
- There are 40% more households with 3 cars or vans in Horsham than the national figure
